INTRODUCTION

This index supplements the printed and bound Discovery Index Issue Vol. 22, No. 5 which indexed Volumes 1 to 22 (1972 to 1993).

Taking advantage of the popularity of the Internet, this document is also available in an Internet browser readable version on the Society's web site.

Our journal's authors have continued to

volunteer their time and talents to document and understand our local natural history. Thank you! New authors are always welcome—reading between the lines of the index should give you numerous ideas of locally relevant subjects lightly covered to date or not even addressed. We have a readership hungry for information about our natural history—food for thought!

USING THE INDEX

For convenience, two types of indexes are provided: author and subject. In the **author index** you can see what various VNHS members are interested in. You may want to find that article Al Grass wrote about sundews a while ago. A quick way to find it is to check the listings under Grass, Al in the author index. Each author's articles are listed in chronological order.

The **subject index** is based on keywords either from the title or the article text. Say you are writing an article about owls, or having been out on a field trip, want to know more about the owl you saw. Look up owls in the index and you will find several articles.

Any index involves editorial judgement calls. If a subject heading had only one entry it was usually combined with another, more general, subject. Subjects that contained an overly large number of entries were often broken up into two or more detailed headings tailored for the region we inhabit.

Book reviews are indexed only under Book Reviews (Subject Index) and by the author of the review (Author Index).

Titles have been edited to remove initial articles (A, An, The) and sometimes notes were added in square brackets to clarify a title.
